



## **Grants for the Introduction to Chinese Law course to be taught in Beijing in March 2010**

As part of the collaboration agreement between the Autonomous University of Madrid (UAM) and the City Council of the capital to promote knowledge of the Chinese legal system through the China School of Law, both institutions have announced a call for ten grants for the Introduction to Chinese Law course to be taught in Beijing between 15 and 19 March 2010.

The grants are available to graduates wishing to complement their training with basic notions relating to the legal mechanisms governing an economy of such growing importance as that of China. The course will focus on the foundations of private law, and more specifically in spheres such as corporate law, monetary exchange law, administrative law, labour legislation and copyright law, with particular emphasis on the various practical applications of each of these disciplines.

There will be four grants of €100 for Beijing residents, four of €900 for residents in the rest of China, and a further two of €1,300 for graduates resident in Spain. The course will be taught in English, and one of the prerequisites for applying for the grants will be that applicants accredit possession of an English language qualification such as Cambridge CFE, TOEFL (60) or equivalent. The applicant must be in possession of a Master degree, Bachelor or similar.

The application form must be accompanied by the following documents:

- Curriculum vitae of the applicant.
- Proof of English proficiency.
- Other documents of title or merits claimed in the resume.

Within seven days of receiving a notification of the grant, the beneficiary is required to sign a commitment letter confirming that he/she will attend all sessions of the course. The Commission will propose other three candidates short-listed in the main selection process that will be granted in case of any vacancy created by resignation or retirement.
