GAS



Don't turn any lights on or off if you can smell gas. Leave the switches alone.


Don't try to find the source of a leak with a lighter, matches, etc.

Don't block ventilation grilles or pipes for heating boilers (if they can't work properly, they could smother you).

Don't store bits and bobs in the spaces around heating systems.

Don't overload power sockets.

Don't overheat electric devices that use resistances (fan heaters, hairdryers, etc.).

HENS



Don't wear loose sleeves when cooking.

Don't leave things cooking on the stove unattended.

Don't throw cigarette ends into the waste bucket without wetting them first.


What you MUST NOT do

COMMUNITY

DON'T forget that you are responsible for the maintenance of the installations (lifts, heating system, boilers, power generators, etc.).

DON'T allow storage of objects in areas of transit or service areas.

DON'T allow staircases without proper compartmentalization and make sure doorways are not obstructed.

If you notice a smell of gas, air the room and close the stop cock.

Make it a habit to close the stop cock when you are not using the device.

HEAT



Always respect the necessary distance between heating apparatus and easily combustible materials in the home (curtains, tablecloths, bedspreads, etc.).

ELECT



Modernize your electrical installation and include protective devices (earthing, differential fuses, etc.)

KITC



If the frying pan catches fire, try to cover it or add more oil (never pour water on it).

What you MUST do

MAKE SURE all current regulations are complied with.
DEMAND plans prepared and reviewed by competent experts.

MAKE SURE that any building work is carried out by companies properly registered with the competent authority in the Madrid Regional Community

DEMAND the supply and maintenance of all necessary protective equipment (fire extinguishers, smoke detectors, emergency lighting, etc.).

KEEP inspection reports.
